Thank you for your letter of August 25, 1982, with respect to the procedure for confidential release to your Department of ingredients commonly added to cigarettes in the United States.


As we agreed, and as mentioned in your letter, Mr. Temko has been at work on the compilation of the information on the commonly added ingredients. He reports to me that he expects to have the material assembled, and ready for access by your representatives, by mid-September or possibly earlier.

With respect to the question of disclosure of ingredients used by fewer than three manufacturers but used in significant quantities, Mr. Temko also has that matter under consideration and he is hopeful that we will be in a position to resolve it, and furnish information on such ingredients, at the time the other ingredient information is available.

I trust that this schedule is satisfactory to you. Like you, I am confident that the cooperative efforts which have characterized our discussions and agreement will be maintained.
