Tobacco Institute Fire Education Funds Low

Peter Sparber, Director of Fire Protection for the Tobacco Institute, recently stated that more than 1400 volunteer fire departments have received a recruitment program sponsored by the Tobacco Institute. The Tobacco Institute also gave \$80,000 to develop a smoke detector program. Progress on that program: a draft received, with much work left to be completed.

Sparber indicated that the Tobacco Institute has also given out funding to city officials in over 40 major cities. When asked what specific cities or programs had been funded, he replied, "It may make those who have received financial assistance nervous if we told you who and what the programs consisted of."

According to Mr. Sparber, many calls and letters were received at the Tobacco Institute from IFBE members. Although the 60 billion dollar tobacco industry is limited in the money which can be spent for fire education, some money has been allocated for fire education. We encourage them to continue funding these important life safety programs.
