
NOTES ON STANDARD POSED BY KENYA BUREAU OF STANDARDS

Standard Specification for Cigarettes

Consideration of the parameters which define manufactured 'articles' used for smoking (as cigarettes) in various countries are so broad that a definition would probably be meaningless. Generally, standards agreed by ISO should be applicable in all countries.

Since cigarettes are identified uniquely by adults throughout the world, it is considered that there is no case for preparing a formal ISO description.

It is also quite clear that the progress of the appropriate ISO Committees which are responsible for the standardisation of test methods, for the determination of both the physical parameters of cigarettes and the chemical analysis of tobacco and smoke, has so far not been delayed by the lack of a precise definition of cigarettes. In these circumstances it would appear that a precise definition is totally unnecessary.
