EEG and Smoking: Chronic Effects

She feels fairly strongly that there is a case for an analysis of variance using all subjects, and it is only fair that I pass on her point of view. However, whether it is feasible to do so is another matter, bearing in mind that Paul Lewis has now left B.A.T and also the possible difficulties in getting hold of the original data.
