

## OTHER KEY BILLS ON LEGISLATIVE CALENDARS

A brief summary of other key bills on the calendars, subject to the Thursday deadline, are noted below. For information about the measures, or those listed, call the MMA office.

### HOUSE CALENDAR

- H 103 - Revises law dealing with licensing of electrical contractors
- H 248 - Expand the number of enterprise zones eligible for financial incentives
- H 336 - Requires vote on annexation proposals
- H 364 - Requires out-of-state employer to have written contract with in-state commissioned representatives
- H 532 - Makes administrative changes to income tax and corporate franchise laws
- H 549 - Requires owners of vehicles to have liability insurance
- H 591 - Licenses and regulates occupational therapists
- H 601 - Raises teacher pay. Other bills raise salaries other public employees
- H 699 - Computer software defined as manufacturing machinery for sales tax purpose
- H 798 - Re-enacts aircraft registration law in lieu ad valorem taxation
- H 838 - Establishes procedure for registration of voters by mail
- H 934 - Bordering landowners pay for paving county road if majority approves
- H 979 - Creates Mississippi Modular Buildings Act
- H 993 - Clarifies law dealing with limited partnerships
- H 1075 - Revises the securities law

### SENATE CALENDAR

- S 2057 - Requires payment insurance claims in 60 days or penalty and cause action
- S 2060 - Re-enacts one-stop permitting law
- S 2211 - Repeals presumption railroad negligent because damages have occurred
- S 2221 - Requires Board Supervisors maintain properties for volunteer firemen
- S 2230 - Revises interstate motor fuel tax law
- S 2300 - Revises law dealing with certification of Health Maintenance Organization
- S 2329 - Requires reporting of communicable diseases
- S 2342 - Licenses and regulates occupational therapists by Health Department
- S 2410 - Provides for mandatory use of seat belts
- S 2421 - Non-resident alien can own land for industrial purposes
- S 2422 - Authorizes multi-bank holding companies
- S 2606 - Establishes statewide litter prevention program
- S 2626 - Clarifies procedure for Welfare Dept. to administer out-of-state child support orders; allows due process to employee before employer involved
- S 2629 - Increase interest rate on judgements from 8% to 10% from date of demand
- S 2828 - Preference to contractor hiring 80% or more workers from Mississippi
- S 2925 - Abolishes R & D Center. Places some functions under College Board. Other functions to reorganize Dept. Economic Development under Governor
- S 2928 - Abolishes Dept. of Corrections and places under Governor
- S 2934 - Sets \$500 property damage to require accident report

### ENVIRONMENTAL BILLS

- H 523 & S 2857 - Similar bills that create an underground storage tank regulatory law funded by a .002¢ tax on motor fuels and a \$75 tank registration fee
- S 2669 - Authorizes Energy & Transportation Board to develop a hazardous materials management plan
- S 2904 - Requires Department of Natural Resources to issue permits to transporters of hazardous wastes
- S 2289 - Revises law dealing with imposing civil penalties by DNR
- S 2041 - Repeals law requiring license or bond for disposal solid wastes
