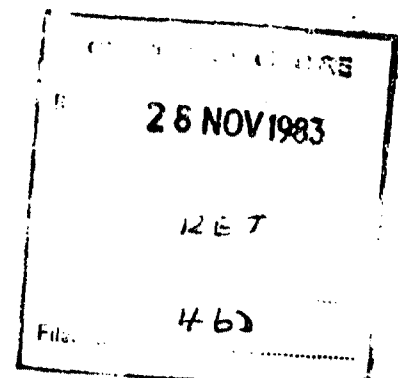
Mrs Renée Short (Wolverhampton North East): To ask Mr Chancellor of the Exchequer, if, in view of the report from the Royal College of Physicians indicating that 100,000 people die prematurely each year because of smoking, he will introduce a much stiffer tax on cigarettes.

Mr Jeremy Corbyn (Islington North): To ask the Secretary of State for the Home Department, where the research on the use of tobacco performed on living animals is being conducted.

Mr Jeremy Corbyn (Islington North): To ask the Secretary of State for the Home Department, if he will define the term tobacco and its substitutes as used in Cmnd. 8986 (Statistics of Experiments on Living Animals).
